HISTORY

With its array of celebrated sun-soaked vineyards and captivating sights, the village of Pommard is surrounded by ageless, timeless beauty. At its heart, is Château de Pommard, a historic estate established in the early 18th century. The estate's walled Clos Marey-Monge is a 20 hectare monopole and a UNESCO heritage protected Burgundy climat, cultivating century-old vines. The distinct, but complementary, terroirs are farmed biodynamically, naturally fermented, and aged separately, creating wines of complexity, power and grace.

VINIFICATION and MATURATION

The 75 rows of this namesake plot give us a wine that serves as the backbone of Pommard's well-known Clos Marey-Monge Monopole. Thousands of years ago, an underground spring flooded the 0.85 hectares of 75 Rangs with minerals. Planted in 1962 and 1964, this plot is located at the lowest topographic position in the Clos Marey-Monge. It benefits from shallow limestone-rich soil that produces a Pinot Noir with prominent mineral notes and a salty finish. Hand-harvested organic grapes, hand-sorted on a vibrating table. 30% whole-cluster. Placed into stainless steel fermentation vats by gravity flow. Weeks-long maceration, minimal pumping-over and punching-down. Pressing in pneumatic press. Placed in 15% new French oak barrels for 18 months of aging on fine lees.

TASTING NOTES

Fresh and deliciously chiseled with silky tannins. With its saline, mineral finish, 75 Rangs 2019 stands out as a refined wine crafted for aging. Youthful aromas of red fruit, sweet plum, some oak and dry spices.
